4	and testified as follows:

6	DIRECT EXAMINATION

8	Q Would you tell us your name, please, sir?
9	A Lt. Robert L. Winkler, W-i-n-k-l-e-r.
10	Q And what is your occupation or profession,
11	sir?
12	A. I am a watch commander, second watch,
13	DuPage County Correction Center.
14	Q And for how long have you been associated
15	with the DuPage County Sheriff's Office?
16	A. 14 years.
17	Q Back in May and June of 1984, last May and
18	June, what were your duties and responsibilities
19	at that time?
20	A. At that time I was referred to as a
21	superintendent.
22	I carried the same duties as I do now.
23	I'm in charge of the afternoon watch
24	from 3:00 until 11:30 at night.

1	Q Is that the same time period that you worked
2	back in May and June or
3	A. That is, sir.
4	Q. Okay.
5	And directing your attention to
6	approximately June 6th, 1984, did you have a
7	conversation with an inmate in the DuPage County
8	Jail by the name of Alex Hernandez?
9	
10	A. Yes, sir, I did.
11	Q And where did that conversation take place?
	A. The conversation itself took place in
12	my office.
13	Q Okay.
14	What circumstances led to that
15	conversation, if you can tell us?
16	A I was making a tour of the facility on the
17	first floor in the receiving area where Mr. Hernandez
18	was currently housed.
19	Q. What happened at that time?
20	A. He yelled out to me through his door and stated

22	that he would like to talk to me as soon as possible
23	alone in my office.
24	Q Okay.

3	Q And he knew who you were?

A. He stated that he wished to explain some circumstances surrounding this case to myself purely on the basis that he felt he could trust me to convey this information.

He felt at the time that he could not trust other authorities involved, such as the State's Attorney's Office or the detectives assigned to the case or the FBI.

- O, Did you say anything in particular to him about talking to other people instead of you?
- I asked him if he wanted such as yourself A. or Det. Wilkosz. And he expressed at the time that he did not want to talk to either of you.

A. He did want to talk to me.

I then told him that I would then clear the situation both through by deputy chief and also the State's Attorney's Office, which I did.

Q. Okay.

And after clearing the transaction, did the conversation resume then at that time?

A. Yes.

even got into the conversation concerning the case that I'm a busy person. I have a lot of duties to do during my tour. And that if he wanted to talk to me, -- I didn't want to push him into anything -- I would just appreciate it if he would come out strict to the point and if he wanted to tell me anything.

- Q How did he respond at that time?
- A. He said, no problem.

I also informed him that, you know, due to my position, my duties, I would naturally have to make a written report on what took place. He said, fine.

Q All right.

And what did he say then?

A He proceeded to state that on the day of -on a certain day in February he was referring to a
burglary. He was invited, had been planning with two
other named individuals for some time a home located
in Naperville, not too far off Route 65, a short ways
from Aurora, they had been planning to commit a burglary
at this location.

They proceeded to the scene in a late model Lincoln Continental, Mr. Hernandez and two named individuals.

- Q Did he describe the color of that car at all to you?
 - A. Dark green, late model Lincoln Continental.
- Q. What if anything did he say they did when they reached the area of that home?
- A. He stated that when they got to the area they drove around for a while.

He wasn't specific on the time. He couldn't really give me an exact time.

He stated that when it was determined that they were going to go into this dwelling, he became very nervous. In other words, he lost his nerve.

Q That's what he told you?

A. That's what he told me.

He then told the two other named individuals that he wished not to go through with the incident, which they then dropped him off three blocks from the dwelling.

- Q Did he say what they did then after they dropped him off?
- A He stated a short while later -- again, he was not specific on time -- but a short while later he stated that the Green Lincoln, late model Lincoln Continental, then returned to his location, again with the other two named individuals, to retrieve him from his location three blocks away.

He then entered the vehicle and immediately noticed a little girl on the rear seat of this vehicle along with several items, he states, were fruits of the crime.

- Q Did he describe any of those items as he remembered them?
- A. He stated that specifically one of the items was a white automatic coffee maker, similar to a Mr. Coffee, but not a Mr. Coffee.
- Q Did you have any conversation about who had that item, where it was located?

He described the little girl as, obviously,

Her lip was bleeding and she was pleading that she wanted to go home.

Now, did he -- what did he tell you next as to what happened after they brought the little girl

- I'm sorry, could you repeat the question?
- What if anything did he tell you after they brought the little girl back in the car where
- He continued with the fact that they proceeded back to the Aurora area to his residence, where he states these two named individuals dropped him off at the house, at his house, and then left.
- According to what he was telling you at that time, did he see the little girl again at any

time after that?

- A He stated, no, he had not.
- Q Is that inmate that you referred to as Alex Hernandez present here in this courtroom today?

THE COURT: The record may so show identification. BY MR. KNIGHT:

- Q Approximately a week or ten days earlier did you have occasion to have a conversation with another inmate by the name of Ronnie Cruz, or Rolando Cruz?
 - A. Yes, sir, I did.

1	Do you remember the exact date of that
2	conversation?
3	A It was approximately a week or ten days;
4	I'm not certain exactly on the date itself.
5	About what time of day or night was that one?
6	A. It was in the evening, around 7:00, 7:00 in
7	the evening.
8	Q And can you tell us what led to that
9	conversation that evening?
10	A. Mr. Cruz requested to speak with me; that
11	it was very urgent, and, as he termed, he was about
12	to go off.
13	Q And was that the only conversation that
14	you had with him concerning the case or was there
15	another one either before or after that?
16	A. There was one the day prior.
17	Q. Okay.
18	This second conversation, then, that
19	he had just called to you, what you were talking
20	about now, what did you do when he asked to see you
21	that time?
22	A. Well, again, when I spoke with him, he
23	indicated that he wanted to tell me information
24	reference this case.

And I again admonished him of his rights, just as I had done with Mr. Hernandez.

Again, I cleared it with my deputy chief and through the State's Attorney's Office.

But this time I told him that, again, I was extremely busy, and that if he wanted to talk to me, such as he did the day prior, I wanted him to get to the point.

- Q. Was it a long conversation the day before?
- A. Yeah. It was lengthy.
- Q. What did he respond when you told him you wanted him to get to the point this time?

 - Q. Okay.

What did you say to that?

A. Well, I told him, I said, well, okay, fine.

I guess I'll forget about it. What do you want to

talk to me about today?

He says, well, I want to tell you the truth today.

Q And what did he say then?

A. He stated that on the day -- he was approached one day in February of '83, and that some friends of his asked him if he wanted to be involved in a burglary, be involved in it. And he said, no, he didn't want to.

And they told him that they had a problem. They didn't have a vehicle, and they would like to know if they could borrow his vehicle to use in the commission of this felony.

And he stated, no. However, he would then assist them in how to hot wire a vehicle. Then they could gain possession of a vehicle to use.

- Q Did he tell you that that's what he did?
- A. Yes, sir, he did.
- Q All right.

And after he, according to what he was telling you, showed them how to hot wire a vehicle, what did he say was the next contact he had with these individuals?

A The named individuals then approached him, as he stated, two days later and asked him if he wanted to have sex with a little girl.

And he said, no, he didn't want to -- he wasn't into that.

Q Did he tell you what they had told him about -- if anything, about where this little girl was?

MR. LAZ: I'm going to object at this point.
THE COURT: Overruled.

THE WITNESS: He stated that the little girl was at the residence of one of the named individuals.

BY MR. KNIGHT:

- Q And then did he say what happened after he told them that no, he didn't want to be involved in that?
- A. They left. There was no further conversation at that time.
