

1 wheel and was driving, and Mr. Miller got into the back
2 seat. I don't recall if Detective Flowers was in the back
3 seat with him or if he was in the front seat with me. But at
4 that time I started the car up and backed it out of the
5 parking place and put the car basically in park. And I told
6 Mr. Miller if he could to direct me to that area, that I
7 wanted him to do that if he could.

8 At that point Mr. Miller told me to get on
9 Western and proceed northbound on Western. I said, okay.
10 So, we pulled out of the police parking lot in my cruiser,
11 and we got over onto Western Avenue and we proceeded north-
12 bound. When we got to the intersection of 31st and North
13 Western, Mr. Miller told me to turn left or to turn west at
14 that location, which I did. We were driving westbound on
15 31st Street along the south side of Our Lady's Cathedral,
16 which is located at 31st and North Lake, when Mr. Miller made
17 a comment something to the effect of, we're getting close.
18 As we approached the intersection of 31st and North Lake, Mr.
19 Miller told me to turn north or to turn right at that
20 intersection, which I did. At that time we proceeded
21 northbound on Lake Avenue from 31st Street, traveling on the
22 west side of Our Lady's Cathedral Catholic Church,
23 approaching the intersection of 32nd. As we crossed that
24 intersection, Mr. Miller told me to stop in front of this
25 particular house that was on the -- would have been on the

1 east side of Lake Street facing west. The specific address
2 of that house, I believe, was 3308 North Lake. Of course,
3 myself and Detective Flowers immediately recognized that that
4 was the residence of Izabella Lendvay.

5 At that point Mr. Miller said that that was the
6 residence that the man had tried to break into when he almost
7 got caught by the police. We noted while we were sitting
8 there that there were some bars on the windows of the
9 residence. We pulled around to the north side of that house
10 where he told me to turn right or turn back to the east in
11 the alley which ran on the north side of Mrs. Lendvay's
12 house, which I did do. I turned right into the alley facing
13 my car eastbound. As I drove around to the north side of
14 Mrs. Lendvay's house, Mr. Miller asked me to stop my cruiser,
15 which I did do, and at that point he pointed to the back door
16 of the residence, and I believe he said that that was the
17 door that Walter was kicking in or attempting to kick in when
18 the police almost caught him, and while he was kicking on the
19 door, that's when he noticed that the police were driving up
20 to the scene.

21 At that particular time also Mr. Miller pointed
22 out a ground wire on the north side of Mrs. Lendvay's
23 residence which ran down from the top to the bottom, and he
24 stated that that was the wire that the person had pulled in
25 two at the same time of the attempted burglary at that

1 particular house.

2 He also at that particular time pointed towards
3 a breaker box that was located on the back of Mrs. Lendvay's
4 house and said that that was the one that Walter, I believe
5 he referred to him, threw.

6 At that time I asked Mr. Miller if he could
7 show myself and Detective Flowers the route in which the
8 person Walter took when he almost got caught by the police
9 during his escape. And he said that he could. He told me to
10 drive on eastbound. We proceeded east down the alley to
11 Western Avenue. When we got to Western Avenue, we proceeded
12 on east on Hill Street to the intersection of Northwest Hill
13 and Ollie. Ollie, I believe, is approximately one block east
14 of Western. When we arrived at that intersection, he said
15 that Walter then ran north on Ollie, which we proceeded
16 northbound in my cruiser, to Northwest 33rd Street. At that
17 point he said that Walter ran east on Northwest 33rd Street
18 from Ollie, which we did turn right, and we proceeded
19 eastbound on Northwest 33rd until we got to the north side of
20 the Harding School that's located at that -- in that
21 particular hundred block. He said at that particular time
22 Walter ran south through Harding School over to I believe
23 32nd Street and then ran back east on 32nd Street to Shartel,
24 south on Shartel to some apartments that lined the block of
25 29th Street east of Shartel. He said that Walter ran into

1 those apartments or in between those apartments in the 700
2 block of Northwest 29th Street, and at that point he lost his
3 vision or sight of him, whatever.

4 Q Where did you go after that?

5 A After that I asked Mr. Miller if he could take us to
6 the area where the two ladies were killed. He said that he
7 could, and he advised me to drive back to 31st and Western,
8 which I did.

9 We entered Northwest 31st from Western and we
10 were driving eastbound from Western on Northwest 31st Street
11 approaching Lake Avenue. As we were crossing the
12 intersection of Northwest 31st and Lake, he said something to
13 the effect that we were getting close to the places. As we
14 got to the intersection of Northwest 31st and Military, which
15 is one block west of Lake and two blocks of west of Western,
16 he pointed to a white frame house located on the southeast
17 corner of the intersection at 31st and Military and said that
18 that was the house where the second lady was killed.

19 At that time we drove on east, asked him if he
20 could find out -- or tell us where the first lady was killed
21 at. We drove by Mrs. [REDACTED] house, which was directly
22 across the street to Mrs. Lendvay's house, and circled the
23 block. However --

24 Q Across from Mrs. Lendvay's house or [REDACTED] house?

25 A Mrs. [REDACTED] house. Excuse me.

1 And we drove around the block. However, he was
2 unable to point out the house where the first lady was
3 killed.

4 At that time we drove back to Mrs. [REDACTED]
5 house at 31st and Military where I pulled into the driveway
6 of Mrs. [REDACTED] residence.

7 Q Okay. And what happened after you drove into the
8 driveway?

9 A Myself and Detective Flowers, along with Mr. Miller,
10 got out of the car. Detective Flowers handed Mr. Miller a
11 flashlight and we asked him if he could show us what happened
12 basically.

13 Mr. Miller took Detective Flowers' flashlight,
14 which was like a five-cell light -- it was pretty long -- and
15 all of a sudden he grabbed the light with both hands, he got
16 in front of our police car, and he just started walking
17 around in a real hurriedly, rapidly manner. He seemed
18 excited. And we started following him up the driveway, up
19 the east side of Mrs. [REDACTED] house, and he was shining the
20 light. And he was walking over in kind of a hunched over
21 type position. And when we got about half way down the east
22 side of Mrs. [REDACTED] residence, he shined the light on a
23 wire that was running down the side of Mrs. [REDACTED] house,
24 and he said, this is the wire that the man pulled in two,
25 referring to the person that he had seen in his dreams.

1 At that time we followed Mr. Miller on around
2 to the back or the south side of Mrs. [REDACTED] residence,
3 still following him, and we arrived at the southeast corner
4 of Mrs. [REDACTED] residence. We walked around into the back
5 yard on the south side of the house where some windows
6 appeared that they had been pried on or whatever. These
7 windows were kind of rotten and were somewhat crumbly. And
8 Mr. Miller shined the light on these windows and said, these
9 are the windows that the man tried to get into at the time of
10 Mrs. [REDACTED] murder.

11 At that time we walked over to the screened-in
12 porch of Mrs. [REDACTED] residence where he walked up to the
13 back door, and he said, that was door that the person went
14 into.

15 We walked over to the west side of that back
16 door, and Mr. Miller had the flashlight in his hand and
17 shined the flashlight inside the screened-in porch and was
18 looking through the screened-in porch with myself and
19 Detective Flowers also looking in it at the same time. He at
20 that point shined the light on the door that led into the
21 back of Mrs. [REDACTED] residence, and he said that that was
22 the door where the window was that the man broke out and that
23 he took the glass out and trashed it next to the door.

24 At that point he took the light and he
25 immediately from the door he shined it up into the top

1 left-hand corner of the room and shined the light on a
2 breaker box that was up close to the ceiling and west of the
3 door, and he said that that was the box that the man threw to
4 cut the lights off.

5 At that point we followed him back around to
6 the east side of Mrs. [REDACTED] house and followed him back to
7 the front of the residence. When we arrived at the front of
8 Mrs. [REDACTED] residence, and specifically we were standing at
9 the northeast corner of Mrs. [REDACTED] house, he pointed to
10 the windows on the east side of the residence at the front of
11 the house and he said that that was the bedroom in which Mrs.
12 [REDACTED] was at the time she was killed.

13 And this was interesting to me at the time
14 because the fact that these windows, all of Mrs. [REDACTED]
15 windows were totally covered and that you could not see into
16 these windows or see out, either one. It was interesting
17 that he knew that that was the particular room since no one
18 could obviously see into those windows.

19 As we were standing on the ground on this
20 northeast corner of Mrs. [REDACTED] residence, he said that the
21 person tried to get in the front windows of the house but he
22 wasn't able to, and he said, come here, I'll show you. And
23 we walked up onto the front porch, and he shined the
24 flashlight down into the ledge of the front windows at the
25 bottom of it. He said, he tried to get these open but he

1 couldn't because they were latched or something to that
2 effect. He shined this flashlight down inside these windows
3 behind the lip, and you could see that every one of these
4 front windows had little hook latches into an eye that locked
5 the screens on. It was similar to the back screen door,
6 except these were still intact.

7 At that point we followed him on around to the
8 west side of Mrs. [REDACTED] residence. As we went around the
9 west side, he made some comments concerning the fact that the
10 guy was really clever and that he knew what he was doing.
11 And he was still walking all hunched over. And we get to
12 the -- there's a porch on the west side of Mrs. [REDACTED]
13 house also. And when we got to that porch, he shined the
14 light on that door, and he said, he also tried to get in this
15 door, he tried to pry it open but apparently he wasn't able
16 to get in.

17 As I recall that basically was all that we did
18 at Mrs. [REDACTED] residence on that particular evening.

19 Q Okay. Then what did you do after you concluded
20 looking at the door on the west side?

21 A Ultimately we transported Mr. Miller back to the
22 police station and there he was officially informed by
23 Detective Citty later that evening that he was under arrest.

24 Q Okay. You may have said. Approximately what time was
25 this when you arrived there at Miss [REDACTED] home?
