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 but a number tag, at that time and they removed that. Where these holes were, there were reddish stains ...

MR. SCOTT: Objection, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Overruled, if they were on it when you got it, just as long as you're testifying as to what the shirt was like when you got it. You may proceed. Go ahead, sir.

A Okay: Where these holes were there were reddish stains there at that time. They appeared to be blood stains.

MR. SCOTT: Objection, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Overruled.

MR. SCOTT: Your Honor, I object only simply as to the conclusion, not as to the ...

THE COURT: He's an investigator and I'll allow it as to his opinion as to whether they were blood stains. It's certainly not final on that point. It's merely his observation and so noted. Go ahead, sir.

Q Now, as far as these ... if we could be a little bit more specific about this ... as far as these holes in the shirt here that are circled and have initials DD and numbers on them, would you tell the Court what those are?

A Like I stated previously, where these holes are were where the reddish stains were at that time I received the shirt. At the laboratory these were cut out, these reddish stains, and this circle and initial stands for Deanne Dabbs, the serologist that tested these stains. That's why the holes
